Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

The FÉRIQUE Short-Term Income Fund, managed by CIBC Asset Management Inc. (CIBC), posted a net return of 2.5% for the period ended June 30, 2023. Its benchmark, composed of the FTSE Canada 91 Day T-Bill Index (50%) and the FTSE Canada 30 Day T-Bill Index (50%), posted a 2.2% return for the same period. Contrary to benchmark returns, which include no investment fees, returns are expressed net of management and operating expenses payable by the Fund.

On a relative basis, the Fund outperformed its industry median¹, which posted 2.0% net of fees for the period.

The Fund maintained its overweight to corporate paper, increasing its running yield and thereby adding to its overall performance. Canadian banks' floating rate notes and short-term asset-backed securities also contributed to returns.

The Bank of Canada (BoC) tightened its monetary policy to tamp down inflation. As a result, the central bank raised its overnight interest rate by 25 basis points (bps) early in the period before pausing briefly on rising expectation of moderating economic growth. However, growth was stronger than expected in the first quarter and inflation numbers were lower than forecast in April, while the Canadian labour market was still robust. The persistence of the inflation and resilience of the economy drove the BoC to raise interest rates by another 25 bps later in the period, up to 4.75%.

Recent Developments

The Canadian economy expanded over the period, growing faster than expected in the first quarter of 2023. Consumer spending proved relatively resilient despite tightening financial conditions and bolstered the economy. The inflation rate remained well above the BoC's 2% target. Meanwhile, Canada's labour market showed no signs of slowing, with the economy adding jobs and the unemployment rate staying close to historic lows, which helped buoy Canadian consumers.

The portfolio sub-manager believes the central bank's main goal is to tame inflation, and the past year's rate increases should help bring it closer to the 2% target. However, the BoC indicated a growing risk that inflation could get stuck materially above that 2% target. While the central bank is expected to keep interest rates near current levels, economic growth and the labour market appear relatively robust, which could prompt another hike.

Against this backdrop, the portfolio will remain overweight to corporate paper, while maintaining some exposure to floating rate notes to increase the Fund's yield. The portfolio sub-manager is also actively seeking new floating rate notes. While it might be appropriate to adopt a more defensive stance considering the potential for additional rate hikes, the central bank is starting to take a more balanced approach to policy decisions. As a result, the portfolio sub-manager will switch the portfolio's average maturity to neutral over time as the BoC might be nearing the end of its rate-rising cycle.

ESG risk assessments are fully integrated into the portfolio sub-manager's fundamental analysis. Combing the outcome of financial and extra-financial risk evaluation into a composite view through the fundamental rating is core to mainstreaming ESG considerations and developing a full appreciation for investment risk. The longer the portfolio's duration, the greater the ESG risks. This is reflected in the portfolio sub-manager's investment analysis and decisions.

Mr. Jude Martineau's term as Chair and member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC) ended on March 31, 2023. Ms. Louise Sanscartier was Interim Chair of the Committee from April 1 to June 9, 2023, and was appointed Chair of the IRC Committee on June 9, 2023. Mr. Yves Frenette was appointed as an IRC member for a three-year term beginning April 1, 2023.

Ms. Fabienne Lacoste stepped down as President and Chief Executive Officer of FÉRIQUE Fund Management on July 3, 2023, and was replaced by Mr. Louis Lizotte.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager of the Fund is Gestion FÉRIQUE, a not-for-profit organization. Gestion FÉRIQUE receives management fees to cover its expenses with respect to the day-to-day business and operations of the Fund, as reported under the Management Fees section. These expenses include the portfolio manager's fees, the fees relating to the marketing and distribution of the Fund, as well as the administration fees of the Manager.

Services d'investissement FÉRIQUE (SIF) is a not-for-profit subsidiary of Gestion FÉRIQUE registered as a group savings plan brokerage and financial planning firm, and acts as distributor of units of the Fund. A percentage of the management fees paid by the Fund to Gestion FÉRIQUE is used to cover the expenses of SIF with respect to its day-to-day activities.

Gestion FÉRIQUE is responsible for the operating expenses of the Fund, excluding the expenses of the Independent Review Committee and the filing fees, in return for an administration fee, as reported under the Management Fees section.

Gestion FÉRIQUE has set up an Independent Review Committee for the Fund in accordance with the requirements of National Instrument 81-107 Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds to review conflicts of interest related to the management of the Fund.

The Fund's portfolio sub-manager, CIBC Asset Management Inc., is a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC.

For the six months ending June 30, 2023, in accordance with applicable securities laws, the portfolio sub-manager CIBC Asset Management Inc. relied on the standing instruction of the Independent Review Committee with respect to investments in the securities of issuers for which an entity related to the manager acted as underwriter during the distribution of the securities in question and the 60-day period after the end of the placement. The transactions were carried out in accordance with the standing instruction of the FÉRIQUE Funds Independent Review Committee.

⁽³⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once during the accounting period. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in the accounting period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund during the accounting period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains during the accounting period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not applicable for the money market.

⁽⁴⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the accounting period. For money market securities and fixed-income securities, the transaction fees are embedded in the transaction cost.

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Management Fees

Fees payable by the Fund include management fees and operating charges. Operating charges are made up of administration fees and Fund expenses. Management and administration fees are calculated and credited daily and paid monthly.

Management fees include, among others, the portfolio manager's and/or sub-manager's fees, the fees relating to the marketing and distribution of the Fund and the Manager's administration fees.

Administration fees include, among others, registrar custodian fees and fiduciary fees, expenses relating to accounting and valuation of the Fund, auditors' and legal advisors' fees and reporting fees to unitholders. Fund expenses are made up of regulatory filing fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee.

For the period, annualized management fees charged to the Fund before government taxes amounted to 0.15% and are detailed as follows:


